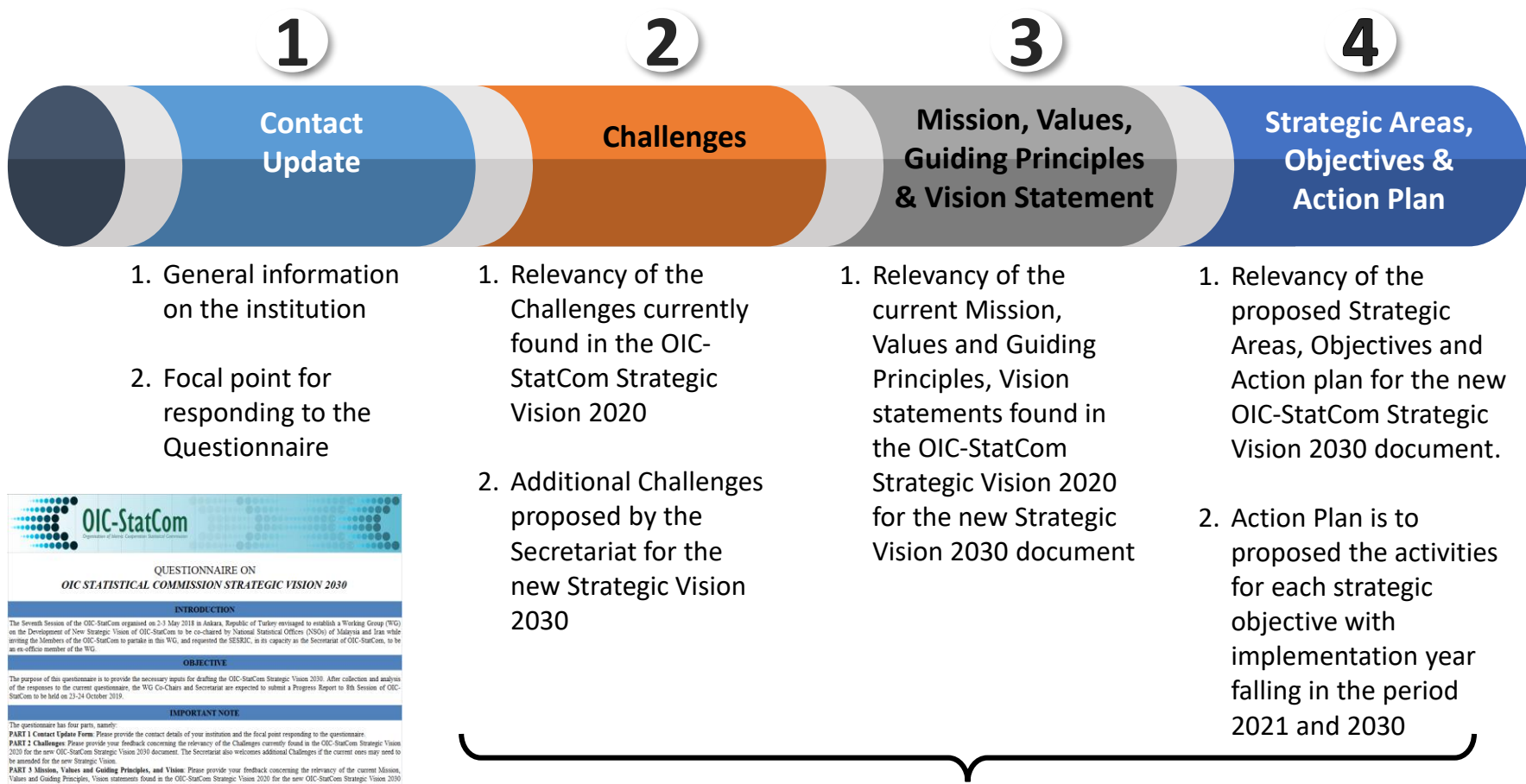

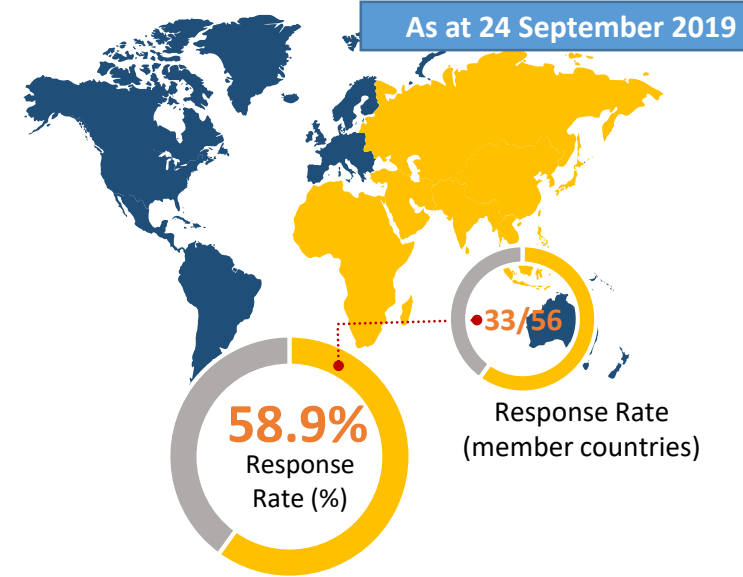

Challenges

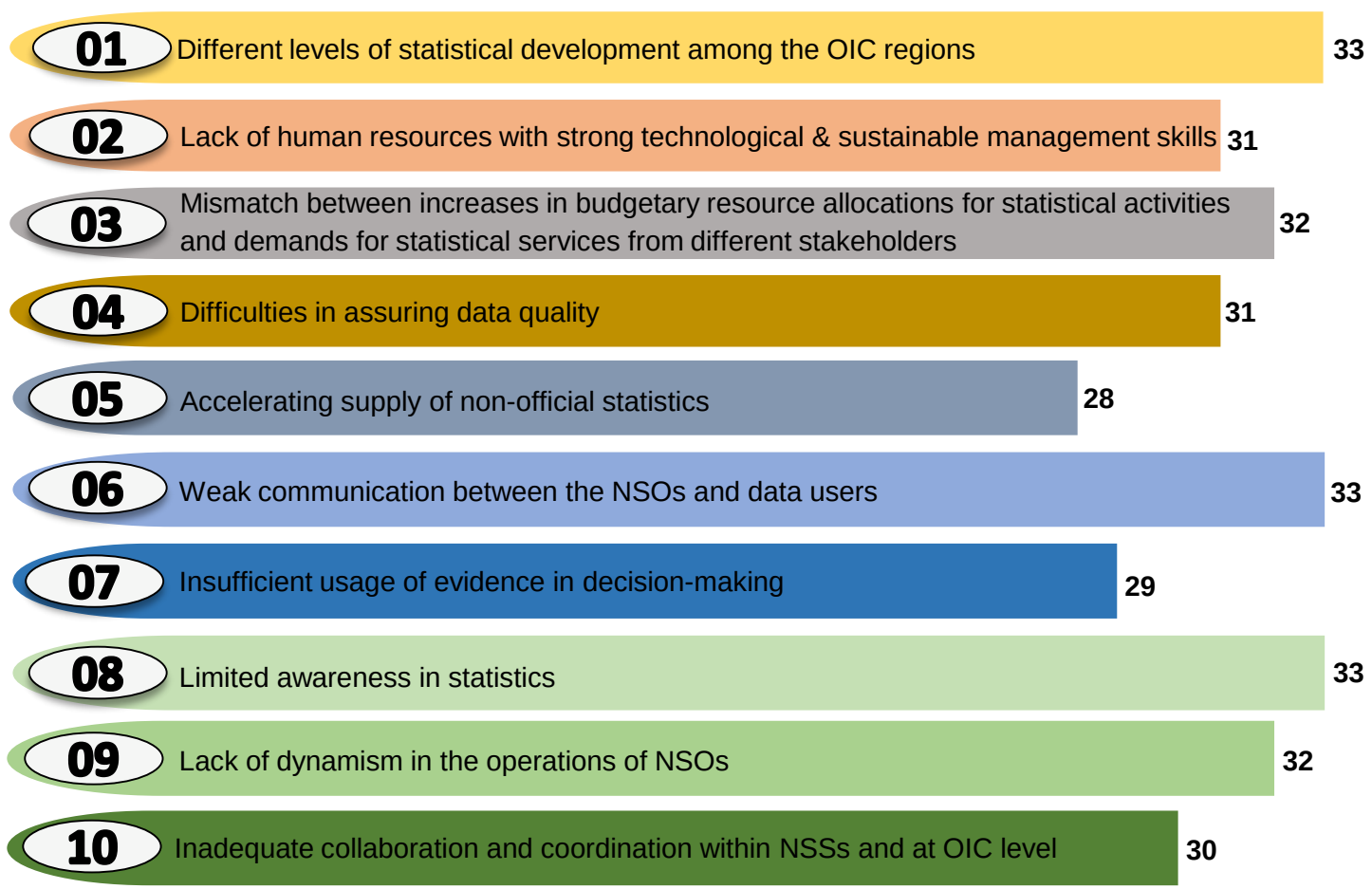


Figure 1. Number of Respondents Stating Challenges Covered in OIC-StatCom Strategic Vision 2020 are Still Relevant for the Strategic Vision 2030

- Challenge 13:** Adjusting and adapting the national statistical systems in order to manage the full implementation of the global and regional development agenda.

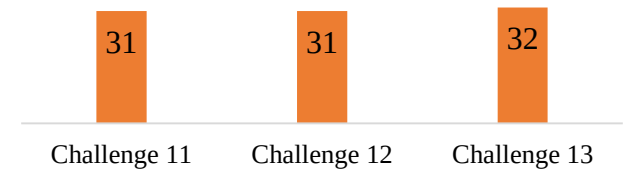


Figure 2. Number of Respondents Stating New Challenges Proposed for OIC-StatCom Strategic Vision 2030 are Relevant



Suggestion from some countries as follows:

Challenges #5, #7, and #11 - Propose to **rewording or changes** in the annotations of the relevant challenge.

Proposed challenges
- Ranging from “lack of national laws in conformity with Fundamental Principles of Official Statistics” to “lack of access to data at same level of detail from all member countries”.

Values

Almost all countries **agreed** with the existing Values of Strategic Vision 2020 to be included in Strategic Vision 2030.



New proposed values: "Respect"

- ✓ Some of countries suggested to **merge** with "Integrity".
- ✓ Identified that "Respect" is already been met with other four Values.

Mission

Mission (2020) : *"To ensure quality statistics at the OIC level"*

- ✓ **28 out of 33 (84.8 %)** responding countries agreed.
- ✓ Malaysia and UAE propose to reformulating the Mission Statement to :
"To ensure reliable, timely, and comparable statistical information on OIC countries"

Mission, Values, Principles & Vision Statement

Vision

Vision (2020):
"Trustworthy and Responsive Statistical Data for All"

New vision suggested by Secretariat:
"Stronger Cooperation for Better National Statistical Systems"

29 out of 33 (87.9 %) responding countries agreed to replace the former Vision with new vision.

Guiding Principles

100% of members are **agrees** with the Fundamental Principles of Official Statistics (United Nations Resolution 68/261 of 29 January 2014) and its relevant supplementing documents as the Guiding Principles for the OIC-StatCom Strategic Vision 2030.
