Agenda Item 2: Adoption of the Agenda and Work Programme

The Commission will be invited by the Chair of the 9th Session of OIC-StatCom to consider and adopt the draft agenda and work programme.

Agenda Item 3: Report of the OIC-StatCom Secretariat on the Implementation of the Resolutions of the 8th Session of OIC-StatCom

The OIC-StatCom Secretariat will inform the participants of the 9th Session of OIC-StatCom about the implementation of the resolutions of the 8th Session of OIC-StatCom.

Agenda Item 4: Adoption of the OIC-StatCom Strategic Vision for 2030 and Programme of Action 2021-2025

The Department of Statistics (DoS) Malaysia, as the co-chair of the Working Group on the Development of New Strategic Vision of OIC-StatCom, and the OIC-StatCom Secretariat will present the Strategic Vision of OIC-StatCom for 2030 and Programme of Action for 2021-2025 based on the responses of the OIC-StatCom members to the questionnaire designed for that purpose and the feedback gathered during the 8th Session of OIC-StatCom in 2019. The participants of the 9th Session of OIC-StatCom will then be invited to adopt the new OIC-StatCom Strategic Vision and Programme of Action.

Agenda Item 5: Emerging Approaches for Strengthening Capacities of National Statistical Systems

The traditional approaches to capacity development in the context of NSOs have limitations as they heavily focus on trainings at the level of individuals and overlook the organisational and systemic levels. With the emergence of data revolution and increasing number of new players in data production, more resources and new skills are required to leverage new technologies; such as, Big Data and artificial intelligence (AI). This session will shed light on the emerging approaches for strengthening and maintaining the capacities of NSOs to navigate through the requirements of the ever-increasing data demand.

Agenda Item 6: Generating SDGs Indicators from Population, Housing, and Agriculture Census Data

Population, housing, and agriculture censuses provide fundamental information on the size, growth, distribution, location, characteristics of population, and on the structure of agriculture. While population and housing censuses allow detailed data disaggregation, agricultural censuses have the potential to provide valuable data for SDGs indicators, particularly in the absence of other data sources. This session will cover the use of census data for monitoring SDGs indicators from both the perspectives of international organisations and OIC countries.



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Agenda Item 7: Monitoring and Reporting SDG #1 (No Poverty) Indicators

Poverty can be experienced in many different forms of deprivation at the same time, which are not always concurrent with a lack of money. In this connection, SDG #1 calls for both the eradication of extreme poverty (1.90\$ a day) and halving of all its dimensions by 2030. The presenters will accordingly introduce the most recent developments in measuring SDG #1 indicators including the multidimensional poverty indicators and their experiences and challenges in reporting SDG #1 indicators.

Agenda Item 8: Utilisation of Non-Traditional Data Sources in Official Statistics

The SDGs have undeniably put an unprecedented burden on the NSSs. To find a remedy for this burden and satisfy the data needs of the 2030 Agenda, the NSSs explore ways to integrate new data sources and methods (Big Data, AI, data science, geospatial data, etc.) into their systems. In this informative session, the speakers will present the international statistical platforms working on Big Data and their country experiences on the benefits and challenges of using non-traditional data sources and new technologies for official statistics and SDGs indicators.
