PAKISTAN's Approach



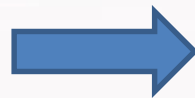
- United Nations Statistics Division (UNSD) has assigned the monitoring & reporting of SDGs to National Statistical Offices.

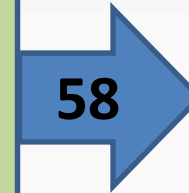

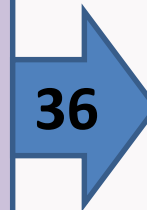

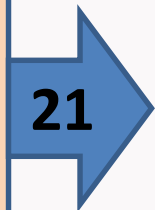

SDG 1.2.1



Indicator 1.2.1: Proportion of the population living below the international poverty line by sex, age, employment status and geographic location (urban/rural)

- **Definition:** The indicator “proportion of the population below the international poverty line” is defined as the percentage of the population living on less than \$1.90 a day at 2011 international prices.
- **Methodology:** Planning commission compute poverty by using CBN method.
- **Disaggregation:** Region
- **Data Calendar:** PSLM/HIES Provincial Survey
- In 2015-16 Poverty was calculated by using the data of “Household Integrated Income and Consumption Survey (HIICS) 2015-16”. The survey was specially designed by merging Family Budget Survey (FBS) which is used for computation of weights for Price Index and Household Integrated Economic Survey (HIES) which covers in detail the Income & Consumption of the household.



SDG 1.2.2



Indicator 1.2.2: Proportion of men, women and children of all ages living in poverty in all its dimensions according to national definitions

- **Methodology:** Planning commission compute MPI and used Alkaire Foster method to compute MPI.(Metadata not available)
- **Data Calendrre:** PSLM/HIES Provincial & PSLM District



SDG 1.4.1



Indicator 1.4.1: Proportion of population living in households with access to basic services

- **Access to Basic Drinking Water Services** (SDG 6.1: Sec F2): Refers to drinking water from an improved source is available with collection time not more than 30 minutes for a round trip, including queuing.
- **Access to Basic Sanitation Services** (SDG 6.2: Sec F2): Refers to the use of improved facilities that are not shared with other households
- **Access to Basic Hygiene Facilities** (SDG 6.2: Sec F2): refers to availability of a handwashing facility on premises with soap and water. Handwashing facilities may be fixed or mobile and include a sink with tap water, buckets with taps, tippy-taps, and jugs or basins designated for handwashing
- **Access to Basic Mobility** (SDG 9.1.1(Rural Context) & SDG 11.2.1(Urban Context): Sec L)
 - Rural: Proportion of the rural population who live within 2 km of an all-season road
 - Urban: Proportion of the population that has convenient access to public transport by sex, age and persons with disabilities.
- **Access to Basic Waste Collection Services** (Sec F3): Population have to a reliable waste collection service, including both formal municipal and informal sector services. A 'collection service' may be 'door to door' or by deposit into a community container
- **Access to Basic Information Services** (Sec F1): Refers to having a broadband internet access, can be wired, wireless or Mobile broadband network.
- **Methodology** = $100 \times \left[\frac{\text{No. of People/household with access to ALL the basic services}}{\text{population/Household}} \right]$
- **Disaggregation:** Province, Region, District
- **Data Calendar:** PSLM District Level Survey



SDG 1.4.2(a)



Indicator: 1.4.2(a) All types of land use (such as residential, commercial, agricultural,) in both rural and urban areas

- **Definition:** Indicator ensure that men and women have equal rights to economic resources, as well as access to ..., ownership of and control over land and other forms of property, inheritance, natural resources.
- **Methodology:** Proxy Indicator can be calculated from PSLM 2019-20 (Sec G) as Question of gender has also been included along with tenure rights

$$\text{Part (A): } \frac{\text{People/Households(Adult)with tenure rights over land}}{\text{Total adult population/Households}} \times 100$$

- **Disaggregation:** Region, gender, type of tenure, District (for District Survey Only)
- **Limitations:** In Survey information regarding legal documentation has not been included by considering sensitivity of the question
- **Data Calendar:** Question regarding tenure rights has been included in PSLM District level Survey, Provincial Level for reporting of indicator
